<u>January 11th to 15th, 2015: Stratton Mountain, Vt.</u> By Barry Fahrer: What can you say about a great ski trip to Stratton? We arrived at the Black Bear on Sunday to find a friendly vintage hotel. The rooms were neat and clean and the beds quite comfortable.

It snowed on Monday and we enjoyed skiing on three to four inches of new snow for the next four days. The trails were well groomed and the mountain was not crowded. The hotel ran a shuttle bus virtually every few minutes to the nearby slopes. Several evenings we chose to walk to the village to enjoy group dinners. Also, it was a ton of fun riding the gondola, telling funny stories with old friends while making new ones.
